Speaker information:

Raina MacIntyre is Professor of Global Biosecurity and NHMRC Principal Research



Fellow at the Kirby Institute, UNSW, and an adjunct professor at Arizona State University. She is a specialist physician with a masters and PhD in epidemiology. She leads a research program in control and prevention of infectious diseases, spanning epidemiology, risk analysis, vaccinology, bioterrorism, mathematical modelling, public health and

clinical trials. She has over 350 peer reviewed publications and sits on several expert committees and editorial boards. Her awards including the Sir Henry Wellcome Medal and Prize from the Association of Military Surgeons of the US for her work on bioterrorism, the PHAA Immunisation Achievement Award, The CAPHIA Research Award and the Frank Fenner Award. She has pioneered concepts of biological threat detection using cross-disciplinary methods. Her current research focuses on vaccines (including smallpox), emerging infections, personal protective equipment, aerosol dynamics, dispersion of respiratory pathogens, and bioterrorism detection and prevention.

NICK KALDAS A.P.M. CHAIRMAN, STRATIUM GLOBAL



Nick Kaldas held two of the most senior roles in the NSW Police Force executive for well over a decade, serving as Deputy Commissioner and prior to that, Assistant Commissioner.

His career has spanned major crime investigations and operations, including counter terrorism, protection operations, armed robbery, major drug investigations, covert operations, emergency management, community policing and over a decade in homicide investigations.

He was a member of the Australian National Counter Terrorism Committee, the peak policy body dealing with Counter Terrorism in Australia, for eight years. He held the statutory position of State Emergency Operations Controller.

Nick also played a key leadership role in protection and related operations in significant national events such as the Sydney Olympics, APEC 2007 and World Youth

Day, Sydney 2008. Nick previously held the position of Director of Internal Oversight Services in the United Nations Relief Works Agency.

Internationally, Nick was Chief of Investigations in the UN/OPCW Joint Investigative Mechanism; he was also Chief of Investigations, U.N. Special Tribunal for Lebanon, and Deputy Chief Police Adviser with Coalition Forces in Iraq.

He is currently a member of Operation Kenova's Independent Steering Committee, the Scotland Yard investigation into numerous murders allegedly committed by the IRA during the 'troubles' in Northern Ireland. Nick is a graduate of the FBI's Hostage Negotiation Program, Leadership in Counter Terrorism Program, and the FBI National Executive Institute. He has received numerous awards, including the Australian Police Medal, the National Medal, and the Overseas Humanitarian Service medal.



Jacqui Lyttle has worked in the tertiary sector for almost 20 years, most recently in the role of Risk Manager, University of Canterbury, Christchurch, New Zealand. Jacqui's line management responsibilities include risk, strategic and operational insurance, business assurance, compliance, business continuity and emergency management. In 2017, she took responsibility for a new unit within the Vice-Chancellor's Office called 'Risk, Assurance and Policy'.

As part of the Emergency Management Planning Group, Jacqui has implemented an emergency management strategy for the University since 2007. In addition to being a founding member of the planning group, Jacqui has a frontline role in the emergency response and has also worked with university personnel in recent years on their business continuity planning to ensure that business recovery is not hampered by poor preparedness.

Following the earthquakes of 2010 and 2011, Jacqui worked closely with the University Registrar to manage the substantial insurance claims that were ultimately settled in late 2014 for \$550M.

In addition to managing the University's strategic risk register, Jacqui has also been working extensively in the travel risk space to better understand and prepare our increasingly mobile and at risk travelling staff and students for the uncertainties faced by global unrest.
